Leanne Towers, 37, told teachers at her children's school that she was trying to raise £20,000 for treatment for her leukaemia.

Towers, who admitted stealing from a Facebook raffle, was given a six-month suspended jail sentence for fraud.

Judge Mark Savill, at Minshull Street Crown Court, Manchester, told Towers from Cheadle Hulme: "It was a wicked lie."
