The Gadget Show may have been off the air for some weeks, but the team have been working hard on items for the new run.

"Jon has just returned from Italy," says Colin. "He braved the rush hour in Rome to test the latest folding bikes. Apparently, it was terrifying! Also, Suzy and Pollyanna embarked on a challenge to find out exactly what tech you can buy these days for £100. The results were quite astonishing.

"In September, we're also going to be showing a very special task that Suzi and Jason recently took part in. I can't say much more at the moment, but it will change

Besides, as Colin reminds us, the show's consumer tests are ultimately there to help viewers decide what to spend their money on. "If people trust us with their buying decisions, then we're doing a good job," he says.

For Pollyanna, of course, it's a dream job. Playing with these grown-up toys, travelling the world – and by all accounts having a right old giggle along the way. Especially when she's working with Jason Bradbury.

"Every day spent with Jason is the funniest," she says. "He has me doubled over with tears from laughing. There's never a dull moment. And when it comes to geeks, of course, none of us can match him!"
