I WONDER what inspired Diarmuid Gavin to become a garden designer. Was it so he could make loads of friends? I suspect not.

The 55-year-old Dubliner is a lovely, funny guy but he's also not afraid to speak his mind. And he moves in circles where that isn't always appreciated.

Take the Chelsea Flower Show, for example. The biggest of deals in the gardening world? Not to Diarmuid it isn't.

"There are some great people there, Mike," he acknowledges, "but they're in the minority.

"There are some great gardens, but those are even more in the minority. And I think the rest is a bit of a sham.

"So half the people there won't speak to me."

He's not exactly Alan Titchmarsh, then? "No, it was a great shock to me when I realised I wasn't going to be as nice and easy and accepted as Alan T!"

Someone who does appreciate Diarmuid's roguish, maverick ways, however, is long-term pal Nicki Chapman, a member of Chelsea's presenting team for years now.

Which is handy, seeing as they're co-hosting a new show on Channel 5 tonight, The Great Gardening Challenge, where pro designers compete to transform unloved patches of land.

Despite being warned he could be

"tricky", the ex-talent show judge clicked with Diarmuid the very first time they crossed paths, in 2003.

"I'd been doing Pop Idol," she recalls, "so we did a competition at Chelsea called Pot Idol."

("I've no memory of that..." Diarmuid chips in.)

"A little while later I interviewed him at Chelsea for BBC Breakfast, about a row he'd had with a neighbour. And he suddenly went off on one, live on air. Everyone loved that." "Yes, I made your career!" Diarmuid chuckles.

This banter of theirs, I should explain, goes on throughout our interview. It's almost flirty at times, but entirely above board (they're both happily married).

And it makes them great fun to chat to. "We do have good chemistry," Nicki agrees.

Hardly surprising, then, that when Channel 5 asked who she'd like as a

co-host, Diarmuid topped her list. "I wanted to work with someone genuine, who's absolutely passionate about gardening," says Nicki. "He hadn't done TV here for a few years, but I told them I'd love it to be Diarmuid – and he said yes!"

Diarmuid – and he said yes!" At least, that's how she recalls it. Diarmuid, being Diarmuid, begs to differ. "It wasn't like that at all," he insists.

"What?" says Nicki. "You DIDN'T want to work with me?"

"No," says Diarmuid. "It was Channel 5 who didn't want to work with you!"

Again, of course, he's pulling her leg. "Seriously, Nicki was very nice to recommend me," he says. "I'll always be grateful." Beneath all this, I sense genuine

I also get the impression hanging out with Diarmuid, promoting a series they're passionate about ("there are some beautiful gardens, and the designers have left a wonderful legacy for these communities"), is just the tonic Nicki needs right now.

You'd never guess it to look at her, but a couple of months ago Nicki, 52, underwent surgery to remove a benign brain tumour.

"I still have a little bit of it, sadly. It was too dangerous to remove it all. But I've been very fortunate. Things could've gone very differently.

"Everyone's been so kind. I've had so many lovely messages, and people coming up, sharing their stories.

"I don't usually talk about personal stuff, but it's lovely if I can help others facing something similar."

Nicki hopes she and Diarmuid can work together again before long, perhaps on Gardening Challenge series two.

"We're really keen. I feel up to it. And if I did get tired I know he'd look after me."

Sounds like this supportiveness works both ways, mind you.

"Nicki is so good with people," stresses Diarmuid. "I wouldn't have time for people the way Nicki has.

"And she does keep me in check. To be honest, I get bored very easily." • The Great Gardening Challenge starts tonight on Channel 5 at 8pm.
